Ensemble Dal Niente is a group of 22 musicians who perform in various combinations of instruments and musicians.



This performance will feature a **trio** (3 musicians) of *clarinet*, *flute*, and *oboe*.

Ensemble means "together" in French, and refers to a group of musicians, actors, or dancers who perform together.



Dal Niente means "from nothing" in Italian.

It is a common marking in contemporary sheet music.

Ensemble Dal Niente is a collective of musicians that performs **contemporary chamber music**.



Chamber music is performed in small groups of musicians that can fit in a room (or chamber), unlike an orchestra. They may be as small as a **duo** (2 musicians). It is named "chamber" music because concerts were often staged in the living room of a house.

Chamber ensembles have a single instrument playing each part.



A **string quartet** is a good example of a chamber ensemble.

By contrast, an **orchestra** has many of the same instruments, all playing the same part.



Contemporary means "belonging to or occurring in the present"...in other words, not old!







This spring's EISMA concert will feature a woodwind trio of *clarinet, flute,* and *oboe.* Let's learn about these three instruments, as well as the woodwind family instruments...

FLUTE

The FLUTE is a member of the woodwind family made of metal or wood. It typically plays high notes. The flute produces a sound that is light, clear, and penetrating on its highest notes.

The player blows air across the mouthpiece to make sound.

CLARINET

The **clarinet** is a **single-reed** instrument in the woodwind family. Its tone is dark and hollow-sounding.



The clarinet is played by blowing air into the mouthpiece, causing a single reed to vibrate when air is blown into it to make sound.

OBOE

The OBOE is a member of the woodwind family and has a clear and penetrating sound. Its name comes from the French word hautbois, which means 'high wood'.

Smaller than the clarinet, the oboe similarly uses a reed, but what is called a double reed. The mouthpiece of the oboe has two reeds that vibrate together to make sound.

The instruments in this family all used to be made of wood, which gives them their name. Today, they are made of wood, metal, plastic or some combination. Woodwind instruments produce sound when air is blown through a narrow cylinder or pipe with holes, an opening at the bottom end, and a mouthpiece at the top.
